What is the Shape of History?

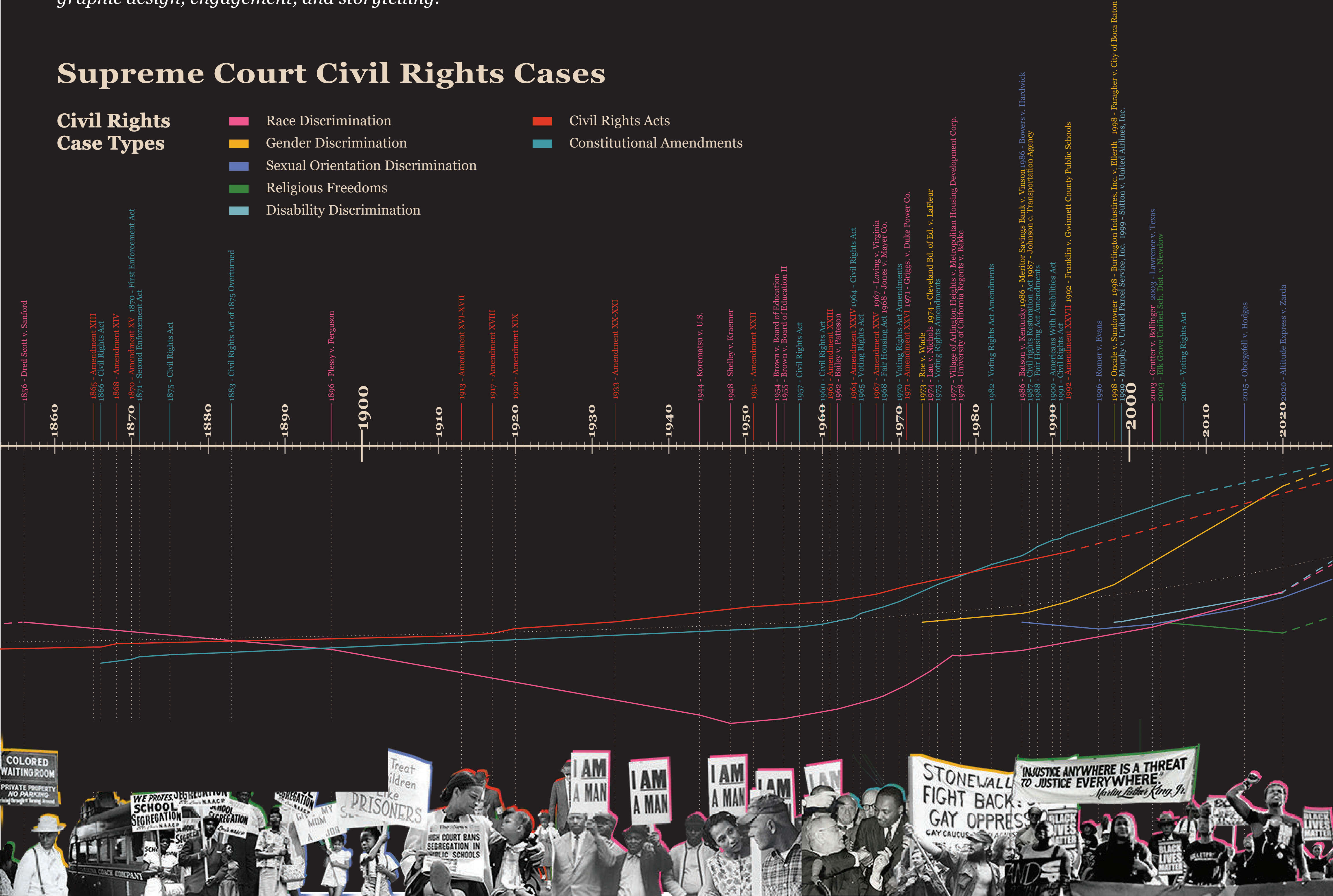

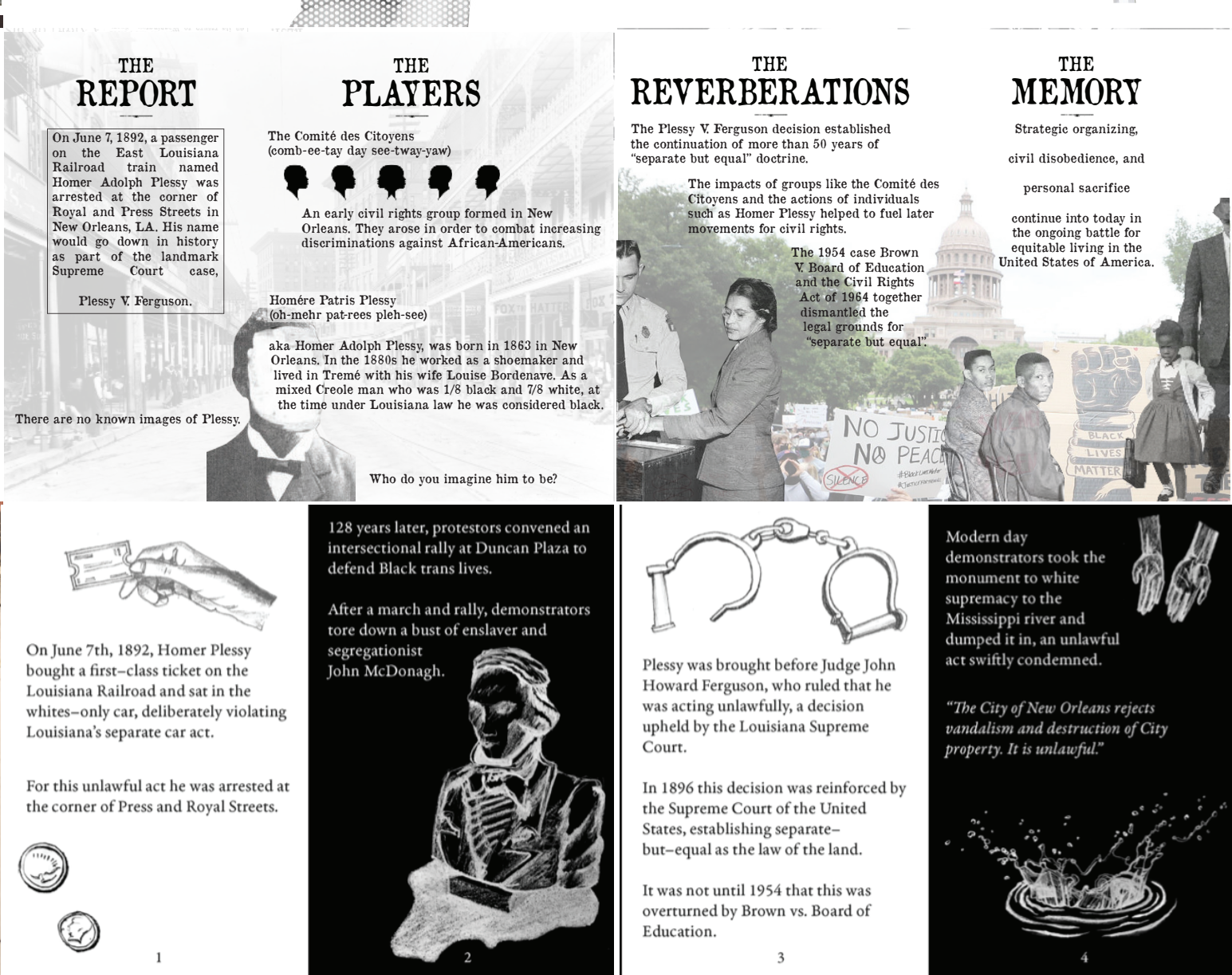

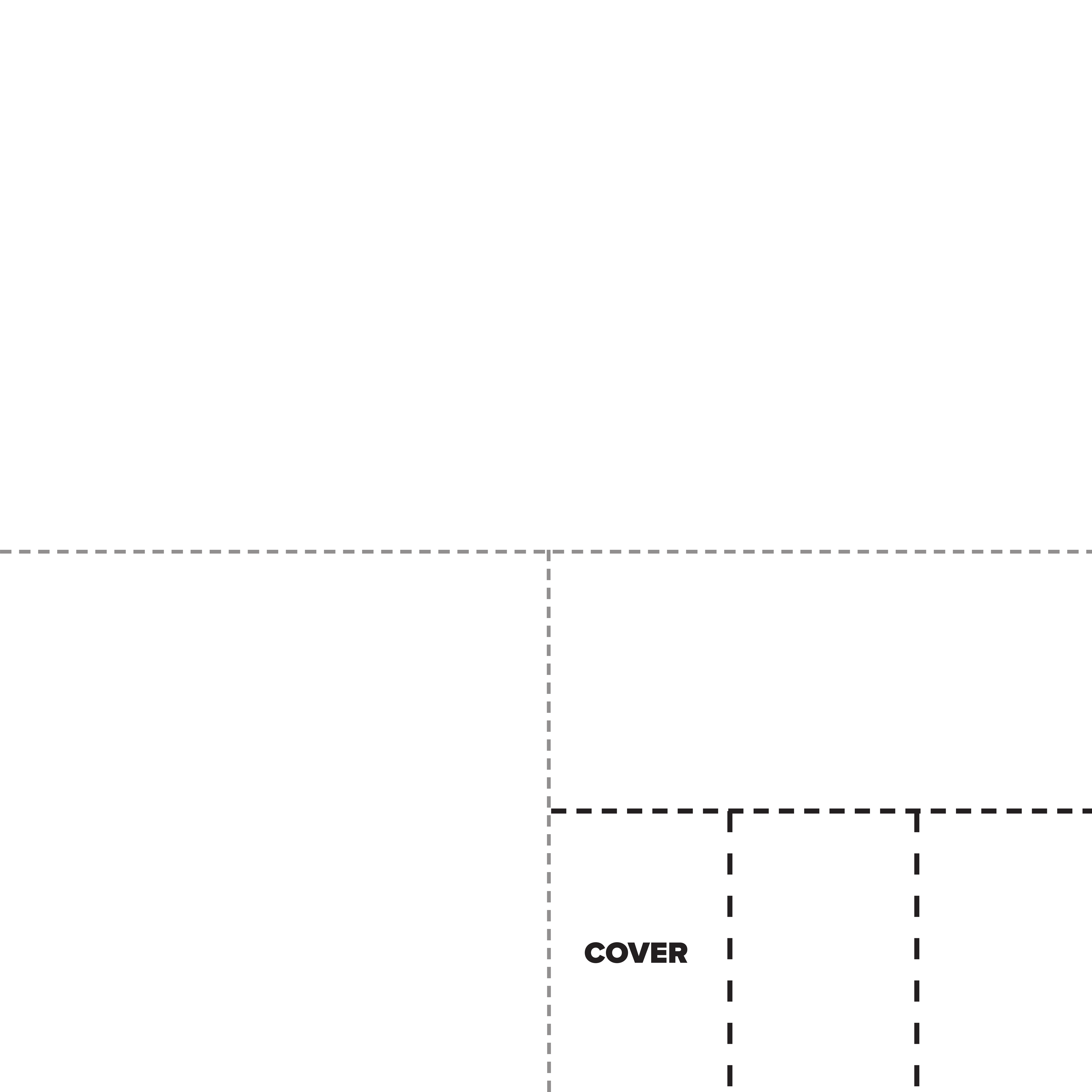
